

## A Titanic Book!

Warren Smith's latest book, *The Titanic and Today's Church*, is absolutely fascinating, challenging and sobering in its analysis of the pitiful condition of today's end-time Church. I have not read such a captivating book in years.

The author is an expert on the New Age Movement. In fact, he was a New Age practitioner when he found Jesus and accepted Him as his Lord and Savior. Since that time, he has served as a watchman on the wall, doing everything he can to alert the Church to its infiltration by the unbiblical but highly alluring doctrines of the New Age Movement.

In this book, he tantalizes the reader by cleverly comparing the fate of the Titanic to the destruction that today's Church is headed for. In the process, he reveals fascinating details about the Titanic and then utilizes them to present eye-opening parallels with today's Church. As the sub-title of the book puts it, "A Tale of Two Shipwrecks."

He sums up the thesis of the book in this sentence: "It is the contention of this book that much of what calls itself today's Church has become a shipwreck in progress as it inexorably heads toward total deception and complete disaster" (page 11).

He clearly proves through numerous quotes that many Church leaders today have bought into the fundamental New Age concept of "God within us." They often express it as "God's Dream of Oneness" — the "Oneness" being "the shared universal divinity of all mankind" (page 103). Warren's response is that "God doesn't dream, daydream or pipedream when it comes to the future. God already knows the future and what it holds" (page 84).

Besides the totally unbiblical idea of God residing in all people, Warren points out that the "Dream" of many of the Church's leaders today is for a great end-time revival. Warren's response is that "the Bible describes a great last-days deception, not a great last-days revival" (page 125). To which I would


heartily agree.

Warren expresses his frustration over the unwillingness of today's Christian leaders to heed the warning of spiritual watchmen, just as the Titanic's captain ignored the dire warnings that were communicated to him about icebergs in the vicinity of his ship (page 144):

If you try to "sound the alarm" . . . you are an "alarmist." If you critique false teachers . . . you have a "critical spirit." If you expose heresy . . . you are a "heresy hunter." If you "rightly divide the Word of God . . . and mark them that cause division . . . you are "divisive." If you warn about latter-day deception and the Antichrist . . . you are a "doomsday deceiver."

So, the Church sails along, and like the Titanic, It is headed toward disaster. Warren sums it up as follows: "As we learned from the Titanic, our safety, strength, refuge and strong confidence come not from big men, big ships and big churches that can ultimately founder and sink, but through our reverential fear of the Lord and His Holy Word" (page 132).

When I finished this book, I wrote these words on the title page: "An absolutely fantastic, blockbuster book!" What more can I say? ❖
